

## SUBJECT: Thiopental Injection Purchase

## Dear Customs Agent:

The South Carolina Department of Correction (SCDC) uses Thiopental Injection for capital punishment purposes, S. C. Code Ann. § 24-3-530 provides as follows:

Death by electrocution or lethal injection -"A person convicted of a capital crime and having imposed upon him the sentence of death shall suffer the penalty by electrocution or, at the election of the person, lethal injection under the direction of the Director of the Department of Corrections. The election for death by electrocution or lethal injection must be made in writing fourteen days before the execution date or it is waived. If the person waives the right of election, then the penalty must be administered by lethal injection."

The SCDC has been unable to locate this drug in the United States. In order to carry out its statutory obligation in capital punishment cases, SCDC has purchased Thiopental from a provider in Great Britain. Enclosed are the following drugs:
